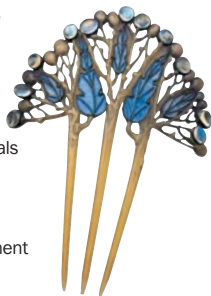

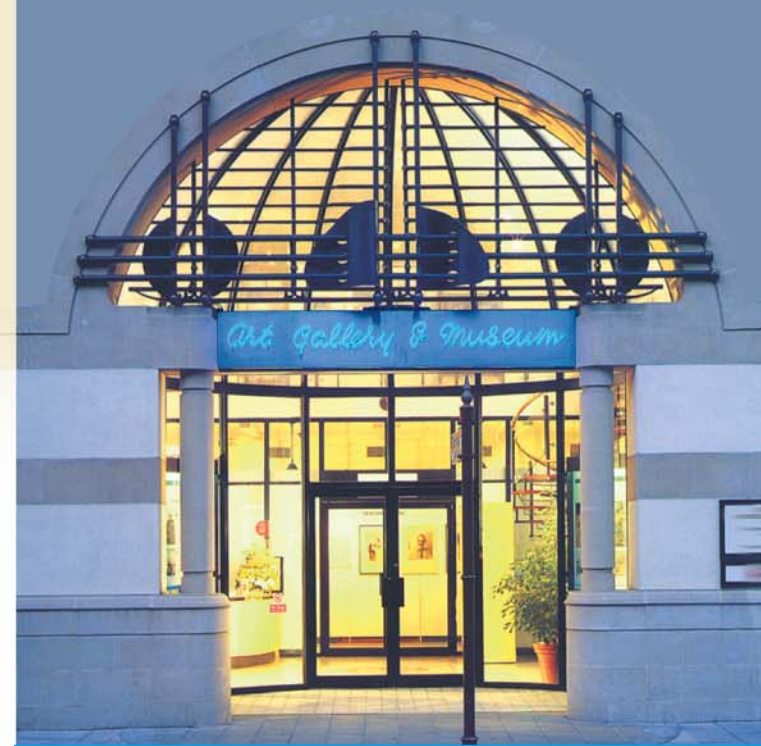
The Art Gallery & Museum will be closed from 12 noon Wednesday 24 December to Friday 26 December inclusive and Thursday 1 January.

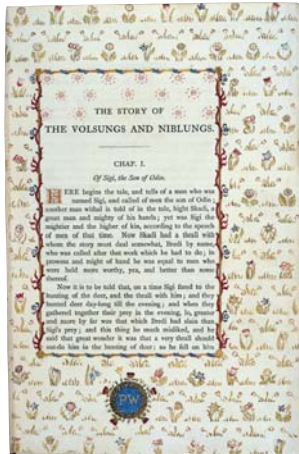

Ernest Gimson

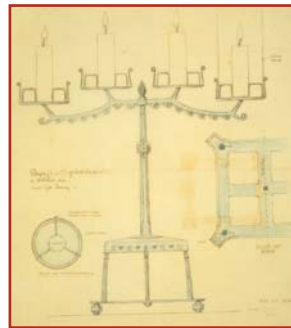
Arts & Crafts Designs and Objects

13 SEPTEMBER - 2 NOVEMBER

Ernest Gimson, described as 'the greatest of the English artist craftsmen' by the architectural historian, Sir Nikolaus Pevsner, worked in the Cotswolds from 1893 until his death in 1919. He produced designs for plasterwork, metalwork and embroidery as well as architectural work. Almost all his surviving designs, over 1000 drawings, are in the collections of Cheltenham Art Gallery & Museum.

Designs with original objects, many on loan from private collections, are on show in the exhibition. Highlights include a veneered cabinet, an embroidered tablecloth and metalwork in polished steel. A selection of contemporary pieces in the exhibition demonstrates Gimson's continuing influence on designer/makers of today.

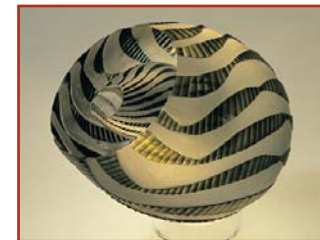
Nine Eleven, collage by Nigel Temple
