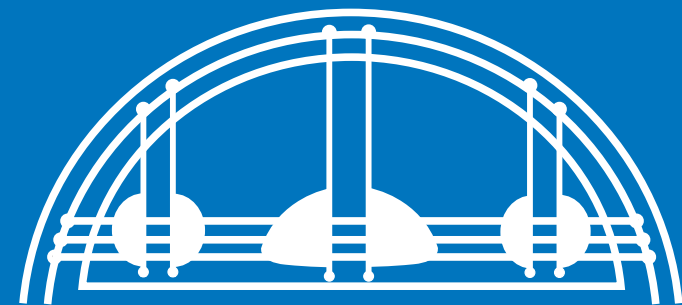

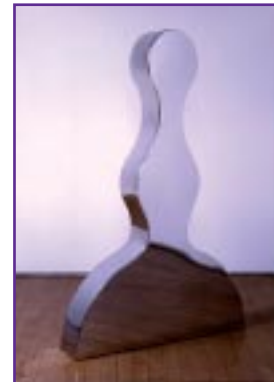
Spotlight on Eduardo Paolozzi

16 OCT - 27 NOV

Eduardo Paolozzi is recognised as one of the most innovative sculptors of the 20th century. Born in Edinburgh in 1924, he was a student at the Slade, spent time in Paris where he met some of the most forward thinking artists of the time such as Alberto Giacometti, Constantin Brancusi and Fernand Léger; and then went on to create an individual style of sculpture, collage and printing incorporating ephemera of our everyday lives.

This exhibition shows six sculptures, a selection of drawings, and collages which reflect Paolozzi's inventive and original style and interpretation of the 20th century.

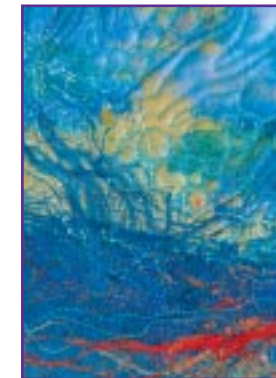
A poster advertising Ryan's Circus at Cheltenham in 1841
